- organise, develop and express ideas using language appropriate to audience, purpose and form

Question 1 - Elective 2: Texts in Time - Prose fiction and film

Despite being created in vastly different contexts, Shelley's *Frankenstein* and Scott's *Blade Runner* demonstrate that we remain flawed.

Discuss.

Section II - Module B: Critical Study of Texts

In your answer you will be assessed on how well you:

- demonstrate an informed understanding of the ideas expressed in the text
- evaluate the text's language, content and construction
- organise, develop and express ideas using language appropriate to audience, purpose and form

Question 2 - Shakespeare's Hamlet or Speeches

'After critical study of a text we develop our own interpretation through knowledge of a text's distinctive features including construction, content and language.'

What has influenced your interpretation of the text you have critically studied?

(Candidates who studied Speeches must refer to at least two speeches and those who studied *Hamlet* must refer to the play as a whole.)

Section III - Module C: Representation and Text

You must attempt Question 3 or Question 4 Allow about 40 minutes for this section Answer the question in a SEPARATE booklet.

In your answer you will be assessed on how well you:

- demonstrate understanding of and evaluate the relationship between representation and meaning
- organise, develop and express ideas using language appropriate to audience, purpose and form

Question 3 – Elective 1: Conflicting Perspectives– Shakespeare's Julius Caesar, Robertson's The Justice Game

Evaluate how the representation of conflicting perspectives, textual features and details, shape your reception of an event, personality or situation.

Refer closely to either *Julius Caesar* or *The Justice Game* and at least one piece of related material of your own choosing.

Ouestion 4 - Elective 2: History and Memory - Baker's The Fiftieth Gate

Evaluate how the representation of history and memory, textual features and details, shape your reception of an event, personality or situation.

Refer closely to The Fiftieth Gate and at least <u>one</u> piece of related material of your own choosing.
