- demonstrate an informed understanding of the ideas expressed in the text
- evaluate the text's language, content and construction
- organise, develop and express ideas using language appropriate to audience, purpose and form

Question 2 – Shakespeare's Hamlet

'It is Shakespeare's characterisation of Hamlet that has created the most enduring relevance.'

Evaluate this statement with close reference to the play.

Section III - Module C: Representation and Text

You must attempt Question 3 or Question 4 Allow about 40 minutes for this section Answer the question in a SEPARATE booklet.

In your answer you will be assessed on how well you:

- demonstrate understanding of and evaluate the relationship between representation and meaning
- organise, develop and express ideas using language appropriate to audience, purpose and form

Question 3 – Elective 1: Conflicting Perspectives–Robertson's *The Justice Game*

Discuss how representations of conflicting perspectives shape meaning and influence responses.

Refer closely to *The Justice Game* and ONE piece of related material of your own choosing.

Question 4 – Elective 2: History and Memory – Baker's *The Fiftieth Gate*

Discuss how representations of history and memory shape meaning and influence responses.

Refer closely to *The Fiftieth Gate* and ONE piece of related material of your own choosing.
