



You'll be pleased to know that work is proceeding rapidly at this point on the skeletons. All human remains found in the arches along the ancient shoreline have now been cleaned up, studied, documented and removed by anthropologists. During this process copies were made, one of which you will have seen in the Naples Museum, these copies will soon be installed in the arches for public view, while the original material is housed in appropriate storage facilities.
